It is a piston meter, positive in action, and measuring all the water which passes through.

The valves are entirely novel, and so constructed that there is the least possible friction or wear. The flow of water is continuous, there being no pulsation or intermittent action.

The Meter is capable of easy attachment to existing services. The inlet and outlet are on the same line.

It is convenient in form and size.

The parts are interchangeable, and repairs consequent upon frost or accident are simple and inexpensive.

Its capacity is nearly double that of ordinary meters. At twenty pounds pressure, the half inch meter passes two cubic feet per minute.

The performance of the Meter is equally satisfactory at pressure varying

from less than one-half pound, to two hundred and forty pounds per square inch.

The simplicity of our Meter enables us to furnish it, with guarantee, at much less figures than even tolerable meters have been sold for.
